

Higher Education-ODADAS funds the Drug-Free Action Alliance to provide statewide training and technical assistance to Ohio colleges and universities on high risk drinking prevention and program development. Additionally, ten colleges and universities are funded to implement a prevention and early intervention program to students under the age of 21, with a special emphasis on addressing underage access and increasing awareness of the problem of high risk drinking.

Women's Treatment-*The ODADAS funded Women's Network consists of approximately 83 alcohol and drug abuse treatment and prevention programs located throughout Ohio. This system of programs provides a system of care to Ohio women in need of alcohol and other drug treatment, intervention and/or prevention services. Alcohol and other drug residential, outpatient and prevention programs are funded through this initiative. These programs are gender specific, culturally competent, and targeted to pregnant women or women with dependent children.*

Drug Courts-*A drug court is a specialized docket that handles cases involving substance-abusing offenders through comprehensive supervision, drug testing, treatment services and immediate sanctions and incentives. There are three types of drug courts: (1) Criminal drug courts that serve adults in either common pleas or municipal courts; (2) Juvenile drug courts that serve adolescents; and (3) Family drug courts that serve parents charged with abuse/dependency/neglect of their minor children. The drug court funds are designed to provide 1st or 2nd time substance-abusing offenders with an opportunity to receive substance abuse treatment in lieu of incarceration. Drug court programs create treatment teams that are made up of probation officers, prosecutors, defense counsel, substance abuse treatment personnel, TASC personnel, schools, children's services personnel and other ancillary service providers. The treatment team meets with the judge to staff cases, provide updates, and make recommendations based on participant performance.*

Underage Drinking-*The Department provides funds to the Drug Free Action Alliance to develop a statewide media campaign, titled "Parents Who Host, Lose The Most" and to support local community projects. The goal is to reduce the number of parents who do not see underage drinking as a high priority or feel that providing a "safe" place to drink is a better alternative.*

Targeted Prevention Initiatives- formerly the Director's Discretionary Funds.

Therapeutic Community-*The Therapeutic Communities are unique therapeutic programs designed specifically for incarcerated individuals or people who have a history of criminal involvement related to their substance abuse. The objective is to provide opportunities in which clients can learn and practice pro-social behaviors in a healthy and functional environment. TCs represent a highly structured environment with defined boundaries, both moral and ethical. It employs community imposed sanctions and penalties, as well as earned advancement of status and privileges as part of the recovery and growth process. Members and staff act as facilitators, emphasizing personal responsibility for one's own life and for self-improvement. TCs operate in state prisons, community based correctional facilities, county jails, halfway houses, community residential, outpatient and TC self-help groups.*

Circle for Recovery-*The Circle for Recovery Programs are located in and administered by a total of nine Urban Minority Alcohol and Drug Addiction Outreach Programs (UMADAOPs) across the state of Ohio. The objective of the Circle for Recovery programs is to prevent relapse of chemical dependency and criminal recidivism among primarily African-American adult parolees. In addition to providing services to prevent relapse, the Circle for Recovery Programs provide the following services: employment/vocational, GED/education, health education including AIDS/HIV/STD education, relationship education, peer support, violence prevention, and crisis intervention services.*

Women's Prevention-*Historically, ODADAS funded a number of Women's treatment programs that also provided prevention services to women. In 2008, ODADAS recognized the need to differentiate the women's grants that provided a majority of prevention services from those that provided mostly treatment services. The Women's Prevention programs were then assigned for oversight by Prevention staff.*

TASC-*(Treatment Alternatives to Street Crimes) Programs receive a portion of their funding from ODADAS and are designed to improve service provision to nonviolent alcohol and drug dependent felons and misdemeanants who are under the jurisdiction of the court/probation/parole system. There are a total of 14 TASC Programs located in various communities in Ohio. These programs are managed and staffed by employees of the courts that provide jurisdiction over the TASC programs. The expressed mission of these programs is to build a bridge between the criminal justice and treatment systems which have differing philosophies and objectives.*
